How the Waterfront Alliance is working for you

Advocating for the maritime sector through the region's representatives on Capitol Hill.

- With economic stimulus and COVID-19 recovery dollars at play, Waterfront Alliance called for Congress to take immediate steps to ensure that our region's ports have the resources necessary to address the unique and unexpected challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- In addition to hosting a key event in April 2020 on the essential nature of our region's ports and their readiness to sustain our critical supply chain, Waterfront Alliance continues to advocate for maritime sector infrastructure funding in formal requests to the bi-state Congressional delegation.

Championing port infrastructure priorities for offshore wind.

- Waterfront Alliance continues to work for the capital funding needed to develop our ports and position them to become offshore wind hubs and regional economic powerhouses.
- Through extensive outreach to state agencies and the Cuomo and Murphy administrations, Waterfront Alliance advocated extensively for the offshore wind industry and ports.
- Waterfront Alliance continues to push for economic growth through well-paying maritime jobs and the skilled labor that supports the 21st century port.

- This includes support for the long term resilience and sustainability of ports and maritime infrastructure, ferry service, and increased movement of freight on our waterways.

Increasing the visibility of the maritime sector for more than a decade.

- Waterfront Alliance elevates the voices of the working waterfront, maritime, and blue-tech sectors in our highly visible annual Waterfront Conference.
- Within and outside of the community of planners and decision makers who work for and on behalf of the harbor, the Waterfront Conference annually attracts more than 500 leaders, decision makers, elected officials, industry representatives, and stakeholders.
